Entries	Each player must complete and submit their entry and pay the entry fee using the Tournament Software website. Short link for the online entry: <a href="https://bit.ly/waopen24">bit.ly/waopen24</a> Entries closing date: Saturday 3 August 2024, 11:59pm (AWST). No late entries shall be accepted.
Entry fees	Open division: \$43 singles / \$33 doubles (per player). Graded divisions: \$33 singles / \$28 doubles (per player). 50+ division: \$24 (per player) Wheelchair division: \$27 singles / \$18 doubles (per player). Entry fees must be paid at the time of entry using the Tournament Software website.

<p>Divisions and disciplines</p>	<p>The following divisions are available:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Open</li> <li>• A Reserve</li> <li>• B Grade</li> <li>• C Grade</li> <li>• D Grade</li> <li>• 50+ Masters</li> <li>• Wheelchair</li> </ul> <p>Divisions from A Reserve through to D are collectively referred to as Graded divisions.</p> <p>The following disciplines are available in Open and all Graded divisions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Men's Singles</li> <li>• Women's Singles</li> <li>• Men's Doubles</li> <li>• Women's Doubles</li> <li>• Mixed Doubles</li> </ul> <p>In the 50+ Masters division (players born in 1973 or earlier), the following disciplines are available:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Men's Doubles</li> <li>• Women's Doubles</li> <li>• Mixed Doubles</li> </ul> <p>In the Wheelchair division, Singles and Doubles events are available. Players entering these events can be of either sex. This division can be entered by any player willing to play in a wheelchair, regardless of physical impairment or classification.</p>
<p>Entry restrictions</p>	<p>Each player may enter no more than 3 events in total.</p> <p>Each player may only enter events across no more than 2 grades. For example, a player can enter Men's Singles C Grade, Men's Doubles B Grade and Mixed Doubles B Grade as these are only across two grades (B and C). A player CAN NOT enter Men's Singles C Grade, Men's Doubles B Grade and Mixed Doubles A Reserve as these are across THREE grades (C, B and A Reserve).</p>

<p>Grading</p>	<p>Players may not enter into events lower than their grade. The same applies to doubles entries with the pair's grade determined as described below.</p> <p>Players are to check their Badminton WA grade on <a href="http://www.badmintonwa.org.au/grading">www.badmintonwa.org.au/grading</a>.</p> <p>If they do not have a Badminton WA grade, they should consider the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A Grade (Open events) = International player, National player, State player, top club player</li> <li>• A Reserve Grade = Good club player</li> <li>• B Grade = Sound competitive player</li> <li>• C Grade = Social, but competitive player</li> <li>• D Grade = Adult social player (entry level / recreational)</li> </ul> <p>In doubles events, the grade of a pair is determined by the grade of the player with a higher personal grade (for example, if one player is graded "A Reserve" and their partner is graded "B", then the grade of the pair is "A Reserve").</p> <p>Any downgrade requests must be forwarded to <a href="mailto:grading@badmintonwa.org.au">grading@badmintonwa.org.au</a> prior to the entries closing date.</p>
<p>Tournament Member ID</p>	<p>Players are to enter using their correct Tournament Member ID (note that a Tournament Member ID is different from the 5-digit Badminton WA membership number and from the Tournament Software website login).</p> <p>If a player doesn't have a Tournament Member ID or doesn't know it, they should enter their date of birth (MMDDYYYY) in the Member ID field when creating an online entry for the tournament, and Member ID will be issued. If a player has been issued a BWF number and a WA or other Australian number, the BWF number should be used.</p>
<p>State association membership</p>	<p>All Australian players who are not current registered members of Badminton WA (or the badminton association in another state / territory) are required to pay an additional \$30 event membership fee, covering mandatory accident insurance during the event.</p>

Awards ceremony	Awards ceremony for all divisions will take place between the respective matches of the Open division finals (for example, all Men's Singles trophies will be awarded after the Men's Singles Open final).																		
Shuttles	Aeroplane EG1130, two speeds will be available.																		
Seeding	<p>Seeding will be done based on the BWF General Competition Regulations (section 11.7) and the Australian Ranking Regulations.</p> <p>Ranking date for seeding: Thursday 8 August 2024.</p>																		
Draws	<p>Draws in the Open division will be Elimination format.</p> <p>Draws in Graded divisions will be Elimination with a consolation draw, unless the number of entries is less than 6. With 5 entries or less, the format will be round robin.</p> <p>Draws in the Wheelchair and 50+ divisions will be round robin + elimination (subject to the number of entries).</p> <p>Draws will be published no later than Wednesday 14 August 2024.</p>																		
Consolation draw	In Graded divisions, the players / pairs losing their first match in the main draw will be automatically entered into a Consolation draw. If a player or pair does not wish to proceed to play in the Consolation draw, they should advise the Referee as early as possible. Declining to play in the Consolation draw shall not be considered a withdrawal from the tournament and will NOT result in a "forced withdrawal" from other events into which the player or pair is entered.																		

<p>Withdrawals</p>	<p>Withdrawals up until the entries closing date can be submitted by the players via Tournament Software. Withdrawals after the entries closing date should be advised to the referee by email to <a href="mailto:referee@badmintonwa.org.au">referee@badmintonwa.org.au</a>.</p> <p>If a player withdraws an entry before or on the entries closing date, a full refund of the entry fee will be issued.</p> <p>If a player withdraws an entry after the entry closing date, or in case of a no-show, refunds will not be issued unless a doctor's certificate is provided.</p> <p>If a player's entry has been cancelled by the organisers (for example if a player could not be allocated a doubles partner, or their double partner withdraws, or an event has been cancelled due to insufficient entries, the entry fee for such events will be refunded. The players will be advised of the cancellation via the published draw on the Tournament Software website.</p> <p>A no-show for a match shall be treated as a withdrawal.</p> <p>Should a player be entered in more than one event, by retiring or withdrawing from that one event (including a no-show), the player must be withdrawn from all other events in which the player is entered (known as "forced withdrawal").</p>
<p>Schedule</p>	<p>Saturday 17 August 2024: preliminary rounds (up to quarter-finals) of all events, first match commencing at 8:30am. Saturday's schedule will be published no later than Friday 16 August.</p> <p>Sunday 18 August 2024: semi-finals and finals of all events, first match commencing at 8:30am. Open division finals will commence not before 3pm (subject to completion of the earlier matches) on a "followed by" basis. Sunday's schedule will be published after the conclusion of all matches on Saturday.</p> <p>The above schedule is subject to change at the discretion of the referee team.</p> <p>Player time exemptions will not be granted. By entering the event the player agrees to be available to play on both days of the tournament from the first until the last match.</p> <p>All players must be ready to play 15 minutes prior to their scheduled match time.</p> <p>Any player participating in two matches is entitled to a minimum interval of 30 minutes between them.</p>
<p>Scoring</p>	<p>For the main draws of all divisions, the scoring system will be best of three games to 21 points, as per the Laws of Badminton (BWF Statute 4.1).</p> <p>For the Consolation draws in Graded divisions, the scoring system will be one game to 30 points, no setting.</p>
<p>Check-in and player identification</p>	<p>Players will be required to provide Photo ID at the Match Desk when they check in for their first match of the tournament. Players under 18 years are exempt from this requirement.</p>

<p>Laws</p>	<p>The event will be conducted in accordance with BWF Laws of Badminton, BWF General Competition Regulations, BWF Codes of Conduct, and Badminton Australia and Badminton WA's Codes of Conduct and relevant policies.</p> <p>The event will be conducted using BWF ALTERNATIVE SERVICE RULE:</p> <p><i>9.1.6 (a) the whole shuttle shall be below the server's waist at the instant of being hit by the server's racket. The waist shall be considered to be an imaginary line around the body, level with the lowest part of the server's bottom rib;</i></p> <p><i>(b) the shaft and the racket head of the server's racket at the instant of hitting the shuttle shall be pointing in a downward direction.</i></p> <p>In the event of any dispute, the decision of the Referee will be final.</p> <p>The organisers will not be liable for any loss, damage, cost or expense incurred as a result of any error, omission, misrepresentation, or change, in any aspect of the tournament.</p>
<p>Clothing</p>	<p>All players shall wear acceptable badminton sports clothing and non-marking indoor sports shoes while on court.</p> <p>In the <b>Open division only</b>, BWF Clothing rules (BWF GCR sections 22-24) shall apply regarding designs, lettering and advertising on players' clothing. <b>The player's name is mandatory</b> on the back of the shirt (in Roman capital letters, 6-10 cm height, in a single colour contrasting with that of the shirt). The player's name on the shirt must match the player's last name and, if desired, the initial of the first name as per the tournament entry. State, country or club are optional on the back of the shirt but if present, it must be the player's current state or country of residence, and be below the player's name, in Roman capital letters of 5 cm height.</p> <p>In <b>Graded divisions</b>, BWF Clothing rules on designs, lettering and advertising shall not apply and any badminton or similar sports clothing is acceptable. However, if there is a name on the back of the shirt, it must be the name of the player and not anyone else; if there is a state or country name on the back of the shirt, it must be player's current state or country of residence.</p>
<p>Umpiring and line judging</p>	<p>Any player participating in the tournament must act as an umpire or line judge if called upon. If a player is umpiring a match and is unsure of how to deal with a particular situation, they should raise their right hand and the referee will approach and assist them.</p>
<p>Photography</p>	<p>Photos and videos of participants, guests and spectators may be taken during the event, and may be subsequently used in Badminton WA publications and online resources. By entering the event the players agree to such use of the photos / videos. Due to the way events are run it is not possible to guarantee that any one individual is never captured in any of the photos / videos taken.</p>
