

EXECUTIVE REPORTS

President's Report

I am pleased to report that 2013 saw a continuation of growth in all areas for Badminton WA. This was achieved through significant contributions by many people.

Membership

Our fairly ambitious goal to have 3000 Members on our books in 2013 was not attained - finishing the year with 2623 registered members - still a good result. A full breakdown of this figure is shown in the Registrar's report. Having four (4) Associations and fifty two (52) clubs affiliated with the Association is excellent and gives us the opportunity to reach large numbers of players and to provide valuable services to those who manage and organise these groups.

The automatic inclusion of the comprehensive insurance package (Public Liability, Player Injury, Professional Indemnity, Directors and Officers Insurance and Fidelity Cover) in the price of club/member affiliation/registration fees has continued to have been recognised by clubs as a benefit well worth having.

Department of Sport and Recreation

Our relationship with the WA Department of Sport and Recreation is sound and our DSR Consultant, Mrs Lorraine Campbell, has provided us with valued advice throughout the year. We are now coming towards the end of our triennial funding period and the early part of 2014 will be focused on ensuring our next Sustainability Grant will, at the very least, be commensurate with what we have received in the last three years.

We completed a Targeted Action Learning Project (DSR funded) that focused on the financial sustainability of State Sporting Associations and this was a useful exercise.

A DSR grant to cover the cost of a Consultant (Mr Colin Brown) lead the development of our new Strategic Plan (2014-17) and the Board of Management is pleased to present this to you for ratification at the Annual General Meeting.


A further grant was gained for work with Rippa Sports, a research group involved in surveying the recreation industry. We are currently waiting on this report which has the potential to inform our future strategies in relationship to moving players in informal groups to affiliation/registration status with us.

The Board of Management executive is also working with Gary Collins from JGC Group Pty Ltd on a Workforce Development Planning Project which is focusing on our needs, not just as regards paid staff but also with volunteer development. This will lead to the basis for future planning in this area.

The importance of the management and structure of Information Technology in any business is well recognised and with this in mind Badminton WA was pleased to gain a three-year grant to update our website and all IT equipment. This has commenced with the Alyka Company being appointed to produce a new website which will better meet our needs. The plan of having all affiliations and registrations done on-line in 2014 is proving somewhat challenging but will eventually be achieved.

WA Health Promotion Foundation (Healthway)

Our 2013 Healthway projects were all successfully completed and the grant money was able to be spread across nine projects, covering Juniors (school tournaments, Higgs Trophy, State Junior Championships, District high School Country Week) and Seniors (Country Week, Seniors 50+ tournament, four Open tournaments, and Pennants). Details of these events are shown later in this Annual Report.





It is disappointing to report that our grant for 2014 from the WA Health Promotion Foundation (Healthway) has been reduced by \$10,000. This has caused us to re-think our proposed projects. Nevertheless we will still be able to support seven projects, though to a lesser extent. One of the benefits of gaining grant money for projects is that participant costs can be kept as low as possible, thus allowing more players to be involved.

Badminton Australia

Badminton Australia is to be congratulated on having the Australian Grand Prix Gold upgraded to a SuperSeries event. This should provide excellent promotion of the sport across the country and also give our local officials the opportunity to participate in such a prestigious tournament.

We have continued to receive participation funding from Badminton Australia under the CaLD (Culturally and Linguistically Diverse) programme and this has resulted in a successful inaugural Country of Origin event and special work in primary schools and junior groups. Further details are within the CaLD Report. Kim Rodgers and I attended a Badminton Australia Participation workshop in Melbourne in October and we are hopeful that further funding will follow for Participation projects in the second half of 2014.

The new Draft Constitution for Badminton Australia sent to all Members for consideration led to much continued work on your behalf. Many hours have been spent going through each clause as consequential changes are proposed, including the move from Incorporation to a Company Limited by Guarantee. To this time the document is not finalised and further consultation with Badminton Australia and the Australian Sports Commission is scheduled for February. Board Member and Treasurer, Kim Rodgers, has provided in-depth and significant responses to BA in the development and review of this document. It seems likely that the final document will not be presented to the BA Membership for some time, possibly not until the AGM in November.

Our requests for more detailed information regarding financial matters from BA has met with some success though we are still have some concerns that transparency is not always apparent.

Three juniors (Phing Teo, Tyzton Tan and Xiang Lin) were selected in the Badminton Australia Junior Development squad but unfortunately there was no support provided in the way of coaching programmes or finance to assist these talented players. No player from WA was selected to represent Australia in 2013.


National Carnivals

Our State teams competed at the four national carnivals with some success. Full details are shown in reports later in this document.

The Senior Team, competing in Geraldton finished in 4th position, the U19's won the Bronze Medal for the second successive occasion, U17's finished 4th, in a large and strong competition, and the U15's also brought home the Bronze Medal.

Well done to the Geraldton Association in their hosting of the Ede Clendinnen Shield (National Senior carnival). They gained considerable sponsorship and through a great effort from many of their members they managed an excellent event.

Thank you to all the players, coaches, managers and court officials for their support of the national carnivals. The parents of our junior players also make a considerable contribution (both financially and time-wise) in supporting the sporting ambitions of their children.





Again, we were fortunate to have the sponsorship of the Li Ning Brand through the Sunlight Marketing (Sports) Company and the provision of all State Team uniforms saved the players (and their parents) hundreds of dollars.

Committees

I wish to thank all the Badminton WA Committees, members of whom are often the unseen workers behind many of our activities. Their reports are within this Annual Report and a study of these indicates the number of tasks they undertake: Pennants; Events; Court Officials; Grading; Junior Development; and High Performance. Our successful year is underpinned by the work of these people.

Volunteers

We are fortunate that we also have a small group of volunteers who, though not on any Committee, still turn up to help - often doing thankless tasks. Their support is greatly appreciated.

Special Thanks.

I wish to especially thank our Auditor and Life Member, **Bruce Perryman**, for the work he has done for us. His continued interest in the sport and the thoroughness with which he oversees the finances is gratefully acknowledged.

RIP

The news of the death of Mr Alan McElroy (Life Member and Past President of Badminton WA) was received with sadness. Alan, or 'Mr Mac', as he was affectionately known, made a significant contribution to our sport both in WA and across Australia. He was a player, coach, umpire and administrator. Although suffering a number of health problems in the last 2-3 years he continued to be interested in badminton affairs and attended meetings and functions whenever able. His many years of work for Badminton WA is gratefully acknowledged.

Staff

We only have one full time paid staff member, our Executive Officer, **Himanshu Thacker**. Over the year Himanshu has worked many hours (often over weekends) on the development of badminton across WA. He has developed strong relationships with Badminton WA members (both metropolitan and regional) as well as with significant government bodies.

The BOM is planning to provide office assistance to Himanshu in 2014 so he can focus more on strategic directions rather than only operational matters and thus we can further capitalise on his skills and abilities.

Conclusion

My special thanks to the members of the Board of Management, all of whom are volunteers, and at times take on multiple roles. **Bruce Napier** continued as the Vice President and as our efficient Secretary and **Kim Rodgers** (Treasurer) gave up many hours to ensure our finances were in good order and Badminton Australia matters were all well handled. **Kelly Hoare** managed State Teams with thoughtfulness and consideration. **Dianne Booth** was meticulous in her handling of the Registrar's work and **Mark Duxbury** continued overseeing events with enthusiasm, although his work commitments had him out of the city at times during the year. **Annie Sim** became Manager of the U15 High Performance group and ensured that this is now successfully established. **Ali Courtie** was invited on to the BOM during the year and took on the Junior Development portfolio but unfortunately, after a great start, was unable to continue, due to personal commitments.

I was delighted to present Badminton WA Service Awards to Bruce Napier, Kelly Hoare, Mark Duxbury, Dianne Booth and Trevor Briedis at the Annual Awards Dinner.

I believe we can look forward to 2014 with confidence as we are now building from a strong base. However this is not the time to become complacent but rather to look to new opportunities and to consider new directions and possibilities. Executive Officer's Report

2013 has been another exciting and extremely busy year of badminton in WA. There has been steady growth in the membership numbers and also the junior participation which is a positive sign for the future of badminton in WA. We have been able to continue to build on our strong relations with our government bodies, private sponsors, affiliated associations & clubs.

A major focus of the Association for 2013 has been to have sounds governance, with all the policies and processes in place -and with timely updates. The BAWA Executive Committee of Dr Judith Cousins, Kim Rodgers and Bruce Napier have ensured that the governance of BAWA is sound.

Other focus areas of the Association in 2013 have been to increase junior participation and also to improve junior performances at national level. The BAWA Junior Participation Plan and Junior High Performance Plan 2013-15 were approved by the BOM and were put into action early in the year. Craigie Junior Club is now a part of the BAWA Junior Participation Plan attracting an average of 30 juniors each week. An Under 15 high performance squad was set up with former World Champion Zheng Yuli as Coach. Ying Xiang Lin, Geri May Nicolas and Kai Chen Teoh, all members of the above squad, won gold medals at the Under 15 National Competition held in Sydney. In fact, Xiang came back with Triple Crown which was an amazing achievement.

We have looked at making progress in the way we communicate with our stakeholders by designing a new, easy to navigate, website including facilities such as online registration and newsletters. The new website is expected to be launched early in 2014.

It has been pleasing to see a number of young participants interested in becoming coaches and umpires and the coaching course and umpiring courses organised have ensured that the future looks bright.

In 2013, a number of well organised events were held. Full reports can be found within later on in this Annual Report. These events would not have been a success without the contribution of our volunteers who have worked tirelessly to ensure the players get top class event experience.

I would sincerely like to thank the BAWA board of management, sponsors, volunteers and affiliated associations and clubs for once again giving me your support. I hope that 2014 will be an even better year for badminton in WA.

Court Officials Committee Report

REPORT OF ACTIVITIES IN 2013

In 2013 members of the Court Officials Committee once again provided of their time and expertise in assisting in the successful conduct of tournaments and events at which they officiated, not only within Western Australia but throughout Australia and indeed the world.

The biggest national competitive event for Western Australia in 2013 was the successful hosting of the competition for the Ede-Clendinnen Shield and the Australian Closed Championships in Geraldton. The Referee was Yogen Bhatnagar (NSW) and in a team effort with the Geraldton organising committee, Geraldton based umpires, Perth based umpires and umpires from interstate the competition proceeded smoothly in a well organised fashion, a testament to the planning and preparation of all concerned.

The Board of Management of the BAWA Inc. is also once again to be congratulated for its very successful endeavours in arranging and conducting tournaments and special events at the Kingsway Indoor Sports Stadium and other venues in 2013.

The conducting of interstate events, tournaments and other competitions has continued to enable members of the Court Officials Committee to practise and enhance their skills, whether it be in refereeing, umpiring or line judging in support of the successful staging of those events, tournaments and other competitions.

The Boards' successful endeavours has resulted in a continuing increase in membership numbers for the BAWA Inc and as a result prospective new umpires were also attracted to attend an Umpires course that was conducted in March and April 2013. Most of those prospective umpires subsequently successfully passed their entry level theory examination and have embarked upon obtaining practical experience before sitting for their practical examinations.

Interstate team events

Competition for the June Bevan Trophy and the Under 17 Australasian Junior Championships (March/April 2013)- Altona, Victoria

Annie Sim was the Umpire for the Western Australian team that competed at the above Carnival and she umpired many games throughout up to and including semi-final stages. With 15 teams in the teams Event and 171 participants in the championship events 2,942 games were played throughout the entire Carnival and the 16 umpires in attendance had a lot of work.

Competition for the C P Maddern Trophy and the Under 19 Australian Closed Junior Championships (July 2013)- Hobart, Tasmania

Peter Cocker refereed this Event back in his home State and Mark Duxbury was the Umpire for the Western Australian team that competed at the above Carnival.

Competition for the Ede-Clendinnen Shield and the Australian Closed Championships (August 2013 – Geraldton, Western Australia)

Kelly Hoare was the Umpire for the Western Australian team that competed at the above Carnival.

Competition for the Val Nesbitt Trophy and the Under 15 Australian Championships (October 2013)- Sydney, New South Wales



Julien Bradford (though not yet qualified) was the Umpire for the Western Australian team that competed at the above Carnival which saw the player Yin Xiang Lin from Western Australia come away with the triple title.

The BAWA Inc. policy of meeting the travel and accommodation costs of State team umpires continues to be a positive move which should continue to encourage any interested persons to consider achieving a formal umpire qualification and then to utilise such qualification in support of the players and coach and manager representing their State.

Other interstate events

Peter Cocker refereed several events in South Australia including the Be Active South Australian Open and the Joy Twining and Joan Jones Championships and he also conducted an Umpires course in South Australia.

National (International) Events

Referees, umpires and line judges aplenty continued their great contribution to national events such as the:

- Australian Youth Olympic Festival, Sydney (Don Stockins (Referee) and Jiten Bhatt (Umpire));
- Australian Open Grand Prix Gold, Sydney (Jane Wheatley (Deputy Referee), Peter Cocker (Event Director – Operations), Kelly Hoare (Umpire), Jiten Bhatt (Umpire) and Bruce Napier (Line Judge);
- Australian Junior International, Ballarat (Don Stockins (Referee)); and
- Victorian International, Melbourne (Don Stockins (Referee) and Jiten Bhatt (Umpire))

International (overseas) Events

Jane Wheatley in her capacity as a BWF Certificated Referee refereed at the Malaysian Open Super Series Event in Kuala Lumpur in January 2013 and (as the forerunner to the 2014 Commonwealth Games) she refereed at the Scottish Open in Glasgow in November 2013.

Kelly Hoare in her capacity as a BWF Certificated Umpire umpired at the Sudirman Cup competition in Kuala Lumpur in May 2013, the Hong Kong Open in November 2013 followed by the BWF Super Series finals in Kuala Lumpur in December 2013.

Jiten Bhatt in his capacity as an Oceania Certificated Umpire also umpired at the Austrian International Challenge in Vienna in February 2013.

Bruce Napier in his capacity as a BWF Certificated Line Judge also line judged at the New Zealand Grand Prix in Auckland in April and at the BWF World Championships in Guangzhou, China in August 2013.

Following his recent retirement as a BWF Certificated Umpire Greg Vellacott attended the Sudirman Cup competition in Kuala Lumpur in May 2013 and commenced examining/assessing umpires from all over the world who wish to become (or remain) BWF Accredited or Certificated Umpires.

Peter Cocker in his capacity as member of the BWF Technical Officials Commission also attended the annual meeting of that body in Bangkok, Thailand.

Members of this Committee also continued wherever possible to provide their services as referees, umpires and line judges for all tournaments and other events conducted by or under the auspices of the BAWA Inc.



Members of this Committee can be very proud of their contribution to our sport at all levels. Their contribution at a national and international level is especially significant and their essentially voluntary commitment to our sport (when most members continue to work full time at their usual jobs) is a tribute to the energy and enthusiasm they bring to the support of the sport at all levels.

Committee matters

BAWA Inc. Court Officials Committee - Jane Wheatley was re-elected to the position of Secretary/Treasurer for another two (2) year term from February 2013 that expires at the BAWA Inc. AGM in 2015.

Badminton Australia Court Officials Committee - Peter Cocker, Greg Vellacott and Jane Wheatley continue as members of that particular Committee.

Badminton Oceania Technical Officials Committee - Peter Cocker and Greg Vellacott continue as members of that particular Committee.

As noted in last year's Report, officiating in any category is a time consuming business but it can also be rewarding to know that through such effort one is contributing in a significant way to the proper management and conduct of an event that involves many players, some of whom play for fitness and recreation and some who play for the thrill and pleasure of trying to win. All of these players deserve to have a fair and enjoyable game with their opponent and it is this sense of fairness and enjoyment that members of this Committee have sought to impart to their task, year in and year out for a long time now.

As always, there is a need for younger officials to service the sport. It is hoped that the recent course attendees and others wanting to participate more fully in BAWA Inc. activities will take encouragement from existing members and grasp the opportunity to umpire and line judge wherever possible so as to assist themselves in their own future development and that of the BAWA Inc. in the process.

The members of this most active of the BAWA Inc's committees are proud once again in 2013 to be able to report to the BAWA Inc. not only on their officiating services to the BAWA Inc., but to Badminton Australia, Badminton Oceania and Badminton World Federation as part of their service to the sport.

Coaching Committee Report

The Coaching programme in 2013 has been organised by Executive Officer, Himanshu Thacker and has had two components:

- i) Coaching Seminar
- ii) Level 1 Coaching course.

Coaching Seminar:

A three-hour Coaching Seminar was held on the 31st January, in the Badminton WA office. This was a free seminar and the agenda considered Junior Development and the National High Performance Programme. All qualified Coaches were invited and seven attended: Nick Kidd, Kim Rodgers, Norm Anthony, Ali Courtie, Kay Terry, Audrey Tuckey, Himanshu Thacker.

Badminton WA President welcomed the group and led the review of the WA Junior Development Programme. The programme was outlined and Coaches were able to comment and make suggestions. Overall this programme received favourable reviews from these Coaches who reinforced the message that the development of juniors was essential for the future of the sport. All those present were working with young players, at various levels. Coaches were invited to provide further written responses following the seminar.

Nick Kidd presented a report on the national High Performance Forum which he had recently attended in Melbourne. The Coaches asked a number of questions relating to this programme including the role of WA Coaches in working with the national Coaches to develop elite players. The programme gave no clear indications on how this would be done and some concern was expressed on the lack of guidance from Badminton Australia on how talented players would be selected into national squads.

The proposed national ranking system was discussed and some concerns noted on the difficulties in WA juniors to attend tournaments to gain ranking points.

Summary: all Coaches stated they found the items presented at the seminar informative and that the chance to meet with other Coaches was valuable.

Level 1 Coaching Course.

This was held on the 12th Oct 2013 at the Kingsway Stadium with the Presenter being Edwin Chew. Four aspiring Coaches were in attendance: Phing Teo, Thomas Segitz, Dot Moore and Andrew Lee. It was noted that Thomas, Dot and Andrew were from Mandurah and this was seen as very encouraging to have qualified Coaches in the region which is fast developing.

It was hoped that all attendees would proceed with the follow-up practical work and would be awarded their Level 1 qualification.

High Performance Report

Early in the year the High Performance Programme 2013-15 was prepared and ratified by the BOM. This comprehensive Plan is available on the website and covers:

- Background
- > Strategic outcomes
- ➤ Key Result areas
- ➤ Monitoring and evaluation strategies
- > Review and reporting

Policy, Planning, & Management (Key Result Area 1) was achieved to a large degree as the Plan was ratified, the 'driver's' appointed, budget approved, all Codes of Conduct reviewed and State Coach and Manager contracts written. Although the Badminton Australia Draft High Performance Plan was received there was no follow-up from the National Coach/Manager and no link into this plan could be established.

Athlete Development (Key Result Area 2) achieved the 2013 goals. Travel scholarships were provided for three junior players (no one was eligible, or applied for, Senior travel scholarships) and the Under 15 targeted talent squad was established under Coach Yuli Zheng. This squad functioned all year and the young players made considerable development. The State Championships provided prize money which attracted a good standard of player to the event. Our Under 15 and Under 19 State teams won the Bronze Medal in the national team events, while our Under 17's and Seniors' finished fourth in the national events.

A highlight was the very strong performance by Xiang Lin at the Australian U15 Championships- winning the three national titles, Singles, Doubles and Mixed Doubles. Congratulations also go to Kai Chen Teoh, (Xiang's partner in Doubles) and Gerimay Nicolas (Xiang's partner in Mixed Doubles.) Xiang is currently ranked No. 1 nationally in the Under 15s age group. The other members of the Under 15s High Performance Squad who performed strongly and also achieved National Rankings are: Kai Chen Teoh, ranked 6th, Jasper Tan, ranked 8th and Gerimay Nicolas ranked 10th.

Competition (Key Result Area 3) achieved the 2013 performance indicators. Five metropolitan Open tournaments were held and had strong entries. The Bunbury Open was a great success, though unfortunately the Geraldton Open was cancelled due to their heavy workload in hosting the National Senior Carnival. WA team performed well at the national team events and several players competed in the Singapore Youth International, with Xiang Lin being the most successful.

Support Personnel (Key Results Area 4) achieved some of the goals with Coaching and Umpiring courses being held. Unfortunately the Referee course was cancelled due to lack of interest. New umpires and coaches have now been accredited. More needs to be done in developing Line Judges and Tournament Software Technical Officials. High Performance is a significant part of the work of the Association and 2013 provided the ground work for further development in 2014 with the budget for this already in place.

Events Committee Report

The Tournaments held during 2013 were all very successful, both as regards participation and organisation. For the first time this year for many years the Bunbury Districts Badminton Association hosted the Bunbury Open which attracted 85 players in this event, it was a great success. This tournament was run in two venues, one for seniors and one for juniors due to the lack of courts available at their stadium. Once again, I would like to thank Kelly Hoare, Judith Cousins and Kay Terry for their assistance in helping to organise and run the Bunbury Open.

The work of Volunteers Judith Cousins, Trevor Briedis, Dianne Booth, Jeff Tomlinson, Bruce Napier, Kay Terry, Peter Cocker and Colin Harris ensured every tournament had all bases covered and ran to time. Himanshu Thacker (Executive Officer) assisted in promotion and administration tasks related to each tournament and I thank him for his support.

The tournaments: 'Be Active' Kingsway; 'Autumn Tournament; 'Country Carnival; State Championships; 'Silver Cup; 'Seniors 50+ Team Challenge; and the 'AC Sports Classic all attracting high participation numbers and many spectators. The results for each tournament are shown within this Annual Report. There was considerable feedback from players expressing there enjoyment in participating in our events and this is encouraging. This year we introduced the "Seniors 50+ Team Challenge" which had over 100 participants ... a good time had by all the "oldies" and a great success.

The kitchen kiosk functioned for each tournament - usually as a fund raising exercise for one of the State teams and I wish to thank all involved for their services. Andrew Chai ran the Pro-Shop on eight occasions and Samuel Fan was often the masseur as another fund raising activity.

I need to mention a special **thank you** for the additional work load that Judith Cousins took on as Event Director in my absence due to my work commitments for two of the tournaments this year. My thanks also go to my fellow Board Members for all of your advice and assistance, helping me to achieve the success that we do at our tournaments.

My thanks to all the volunteers who assisted in any way with the 2013 tournaments and to the Court Officials' and players whose support made 2013 such a successful year.

Junior Development Committee Report

Early in 2013 a JUNIOR DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME was prepared and presented to the BOM for ratification. This comprehensive document covered:

- The current situation
- Regional and metropolitan development groups
- Player pathways
- School programmes
- Junior events

It should be noted that the High Performance Programme, though separate from this Junior Development Programme, also covers some aspects of Junior Development The acceptance of this programme has seen the continuation of sound junior development at different levels in Geraldton, the commencement of a Bunbury junior group and two Coaches from Mandurah gaining qualifications to they can work with juniors in that area. The aim will be to have two metropolitan and three regional junior groups functioning directly under the Badminton WA direction in 2014.

The Craigie Junior (north of the river) group was established early in the year, with two Coaches (Kim Rodgers and Ali Courtie) managing these young players. Badminton WA was fortunate to obtain a grant from the City of Joondalup to assist with this project.

Kim Rodgers also worked with juniors on a pilot project with the South Suburban Badminton Association (south of the river).

Junior events:

The Higgs Trophy (Teams) was held in the July School holidays and was a great success. This was followed by the State Junior Championships. Results are shown in the Event Reports section of this Annual Report.

Junior sections were held in the Open tournament events (except for the Silver Cup) and these were well supported.

School tournaments were again very successful. The four events had an average of 135 students (Year 7 to Year 12) participating and no less than 9 different schools being represented on each occasion.

Taking into account all the programmes under Badminton WA direction (metropolitan or regional) there were more than 600 juniors involved in the sport. This does not include those juniors working with independent Coaches/groups—though it is acknowledged that many of these young players compete in Association events.

The only slight area of disappointment is that the number of boys far outweigh the girls- and this is naturally reflected in State squads and groups. A 'Girls Only' initiative had only limited success.

This Junior Development Programme will be continued in 2014.



Grading Sub Committee Report

The Grading Sub-Committee continued its work in 2013.

The Grading Lists which had been re-set up in 2009 have been continuously built on since then so that there are now 870 players shown with their grades for singles, doubles and mixed doubles events. This list is readily accessed through the website making it easy for tournament players to check their personal grades.

The Committee continues to accept a player's own grading for the first event he or she plays in and notes that a great majority of players are quite accurate in assessing their grading- as demonstrated by the tournament results.

This committee met prior to every event to check gradings as shown on the Entry Forms and the week following a tournament all results are checked, with Winners being assessed for upgrading. First-time players were added to the list.

Any player wishing a down-grade has been able to contact the committee and the request considered and assessed, based on the player's tournament results.

This sub-committee of Badminton WA has enjoyed the grading task and the members are committed to being thorough and working to the ByLaws.

Culturally and Linguistically Diverse (CaLD) Report

This three year programme supported by Badminton Australia is coming to a close, though it is anticipated that funding for Participation will continue after the 30th June. In the last twelve months several activities were successfully completed.

Badminton WA representative, Nick Kidd, attended the 'Market Segmentation for Sport Participants' workshop in Melbourne, which covered the following topics:

- How to attract new members
- How to retain existing members
- The challenges for the Australian Sports Sector
- Key Drivers and Barriers to participation in sport
- Progress reports
- What can we do better
- Is your CALD program on track to be self-sustaining by 2014?
- KPI's and Reporting Process

This Badminton Australia organised workshop provided some useful reflection on what we had been doing plus impetus for the coming year.

Two road trips were undertaken: Zheng Yuli flew to the mid-west to work with the Geraldton & Districts Badminton Association and Kay Terry went to Katanning, running coaching sessions in primary and secondary schools, plus adult groups. Both were well received- with requests for follow-up in 2014.

A metropolitan primary school coaching programme was initiated with schools having a large percentage of migrant and overseas students given the focus. Eight schools were approached and all were keen to be involved. The aims of this project were to:

- > Locate primary schools with a high proportion of CALD students
- ➤ Plan four/five sessions in each of the schools
- ➤ Introduce badminton as a fun sport for young children
- > Provide all the equipment required
- > Provide information at each school on the location of junior badminton groups.
- > Try to initiate further badminton in these school in 2014

A number of different nationalities were in these groups: Chinese, Sudanese, Somali, Ethiopian, Burmese, Malaysian, Aboriginal, United Arab Republic, Eritrea, & New Zealand. Altogether 264 juniors participated and all schools indicated they would like to be involved again, if this was possible. The International School was particularly enthusiastic about this programme.

A new initiative: COUNTRY OF ORIGIN TOURNAMENT was held in November and was greatly enjoyed by all participants. A report with results is available in this Annual Report. Two junior programmes, one at the Craigie Leisure Centre and one at the South Suburban stadium, were managed by Kim Rodgers, both with CaLD children attending. It is anticipated that both will be on-going to build on the foundations established.



Western Australian Health Foundation

HEALTHWAY PROGRAMMES





Once again the continuing partnership with the Western Australian Health Foundation (Healthway) resulted in a grant that was able to be used effectively in the promotion of badminton across WA.

Although the majority of the programmes were metropolitan based, the Bunbury and Mandurah events, plus the Country Carnival and District High Schools Country Week (Regional participants) were all successful and well supported. The eight programmes were:

Programme 1: Be Active Regional Junior Events

Programme 2 Be Active District High School Country Week

Programme 3 Be Active Secondary School Tournaments (four tournaments)
Programme 4 Be Active Metro Seniors Challenge (Pennants over 21 weeks)

Programme 5 Be Active Open Events (four tournaments)

Programme 6 Be Active Country Carnival Programme 7 Be Active Regional Open Events

Programme 8 Be Active Masters Challenge Trophy (50+ Seniors)

Each of the above programmes achieved the goals and were used to promote the 'Be Active' message. Healthway signage was displayed on each occasion: the Be Active match desk cloths were used, event workers wore the provided polo tops and Be Active water bottles, caps and wrist bands were distributed. Regular verbal acknowledgements were made and all Entry Forms (where applicable) showed the Healthway logo.

The Healthway grant made it possible to organise and manage these programmes so the cost to participants was reasonable. All participants who were not registered members of Badminton WA became Event Members (on the payment of a fee) for the duration and were therefore covered by Player Insurance.

Each of the above programmes is reported in detail within this Annual Report. Dates, venues, event workers, participants, and results are shown and this gives a clear indication of the success of the projects.

A number of volunteers all cheerfully gave up their time to organise, manage, umpire and generally help to make these Healthway projects a successful and significant part of the Badminton WA year.
